

Use sportweight yarn and size G crochet hook. If you want a smaller or bigger hat, use either baby yarn or worsted weight yarn and the appropriate size hook.

NOTE: Beg ch 2 does not count as a st in this pattern.

Beginning at top of hat, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring.

Round 1: Ch 2, work 13 dc in ring, join with a sl st in first dc. 13 sts.

Round 2: Ch 2, do not turn, 2 dc in each st around, join with sl st in first dc. 26 sts.

Round 3: Ch 2, do not turn, dc in first st, \*2 dc in next st, dc in next st, repeat from \* around ending with 2 dc in last st, join with a sl st in first dc. 39 sts.

Round 4: Ch 2, do not turn, \*dc in first two sts, 2 dc in next st, repeat from \* around, join with sl st in first dc. 52 sts.

Round 5 - 13: Ch 2, do not turn, dc in each st around, join with sl st in first dc.

Round 14: Ch 2, **TURN**, dc in each st around, join with sl st in first dc.

Round 15 & 16: Ch 2, do not turn, dc in each st around, join with sl st in first dc.


Round 17: Do not turn. (Ch 1 and sc) in each st around, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Turn up bottom of hat for brim.

# **Crochet Shell Stitch Cap for Kids**

# Materials:

Sport Weight or DK yarn Size G crochet hook

Note: This cap can be made any size...using larger crochet hook and thicker yarn. Just be sure to have Round 6 end with multiples of 6 sts.

## **Directions:**

Beginning at top with main color, ch 5, sl st in first ch to form ring.

Round 1: Ch 2 (counts as 1st dc), 11 dc in ring (for total of 12). Join with a sl st in top of ch 2.

Round 2: Ch 2, 2 dc in each dc around - 24 dc. Join with sl st in top of ch 2.

Round 3: Ch 2 (dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc) 12 times - 36 dc. Join with sl st in top of ch 2.

Round 4: Ch 2 (dc In next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc) 12 times - 48 dc. Join with sl st in top of ch 2.

Round 5: Ch 2 (dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc) 12 times - 60 dc. Join with sl st in top of ch 2.

Round 6: Ch 2. Dc around. (60 sts)

Round 7: \*Ch 3, skip next 2 sts, sl st in 3rd st from ch, sl st in next 3 sts;\*
Repeat \*\* around.

Round 8: \*Make 5 dc in loop (shell), sl st in 2nd sl st;\* Repeat \*\* around.

Round 9: SI st to 4th dc of next shell. \*Ch 3, skip 3, sI st 3 (across 2nd, 3rd, and 4th dc of hell);\* Repeat around.

Round 10: sl st to center sl st (before loop). Repeat Round 8.

Round 11: Repeat Round 9.

Rounds 12: Repeat round 8.

Round 13: Repeat round 9.

Round 14: Ch 2. Dc around (\*making 4 dc in top of shell, 2 dc in loop\* around). Finish off.

# **Hat Size Guidelines**

Size: full term newborn (13" circumference)

Materials: size F hook, 1.5 oz. baby yarn (I used

Jamie)


Gauge: 9 sc = 2 inches

# Pattern

- 1. ch 4, join w sl st to form ring 2. ch 1, work 10 sc in ring, do not join w sl st, keep working in rounds
- 3. 2 sc in ea sc around (20 sc)
- 4. work 1 rnd even (20 sc)
- 5. 2 sc in ea sc around (40 sc)
- 6. work 1 rnd even (40 sc)
- 7. \*1 sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc\*, rep from \* to \*

around (60 sc)

- 8. continue working sc in rounds until cap measures 8" from top to bottom
- 9. end off, weave end into outside edge
- 10. turn up 2" cuff

## HAT

Skill: easy, crochet

#### Material:

3.50 mm crochet hook or 6/0 crochet hook. 6/0 = 3.50 mm.

4 ply yarn (here i am using Alize Sekerim Bebe Batik (self stripping yarn baby yarn) - Click to purchase)

Scissor

Gauge: For this one, the hat size is for 7 month old to 1 year old size with my pattern.

## Pattern stitch NOTE:

V-stitch (2dc in same space)
Shell (2dc, chain2, 2dc in same space)

## Abbreviations:

hdc = half double crochet

dc = double crochet

### Instructions:

Cast on 4 sts, slip stitch to join. (if you know how to do magic ring, you can replace it to magic ring)

Chain 3, make 14 hdc in same space/loop, until the last hdc, slip stitch on the first chain of chain 3. (you will work in a round now).

# Next,

## Row 1:

Chain 3 and do double crochet in the same stitch. \*skip 1 hdc, 2 DC in next hdc\* repeat \* to \* until before chain 3, slip stitch on the first chain of the chain 3. ( you will get 7 -V- stitch)

# Next, - in this row you will have 7 shells

## Row 2:

Slip stitch into the first space of V-stitch – (chain 3, dc, chain 2, make 2 dc) in same space. Then, do shell (please refer pattern stitch note above) in every space of V-stitch. You will get 7 shell, before chain 3, slip stitch on the first chain of the previous chain 3

Next, - in this row you will have 1 dc in between shells, 7 shells

Row 3:

Slip stitch on the next DC, slip stitch on space, (chain 3, dc, chain 2, make 2 dc) in same space, \*chain 1, 1 hdc in between of two shells, chain 1, shell\* repeat from \* to \* until the last stitch, slip stitch on the first chain of chain 3.

Next, - in this row you will have 2 dc in between shells, 7 shells

Row 4

Slip stitch on the next DC, slip stitch on space, (chain 3, dc, chain 2, make 2 dc) in same space, \*chain 1, 1 dc in next space, chain 1, shell\* repeat from \* to \* until the last stitch, slip stitch on the first chain of chain 3.

Next, - in this row you will have 3 dc in between shells and 7 shells

Row 5:

Slip stitch on the next DC, slip stitch on space, (chain 3, dc, chain 2, make 2 dc) in same space, \*chain 1, 1 dc in next space, chain 1, shell\* repeat from \* to \* until the last stitch, slip stitch on the first chain of chain 3.

Next, in this row you will have 4 dc in between shells and 7 shells

Row 6:

Slip stitch on the next DC, slip stitch on space, (chain 3, dc, chain 2, make 2 dc) in same space,, \*chain 1, 1 dc in next space, chain 1, shell\* repeat from \* to \* until the last stitch, slip stitch on the first chain of chain 3.

Next, in this row you will have 4 dc in between shells and 7 shells

**Row 7:** 

Slip stitch on the next DC, slip stitch on space, (chain 3, dc, chain 2, make 2 dc) in same space, \*chain 1, 1 dc in next dc, chain 1, shell\*

repeat from \* to \* until the last stitch, slip stitch on the first chain of chain 3.

Repeat ROW 7 FOR 6 rounds more.

**LAST ROW:** 

Next for last 2 rows (make 2 rows):

slip stitch on the next DC, slip stitch on space, (chain 3, dc, chain 2, make 2 dc) in same space, \*skip 2 dc, shell in space, skip 2 dc, shell\*. Repeat from \* to \* until the last stitch, slip stitch to join on the first chain of previous chain 3.

**NEW EDGING EDITED on 2 APRIL 2013** 

while playing around with this pattern, i accidentally found a nice edging which is very suit to this hat :) so here it is:

LAST ROW: edited

Next for last 2 rows (make 2 rows):

ROW 1: slip stitch on the next DC, slip stitch on space, chain 3, dc, chain 2, 2 dc, \*skip 2 dc, shell in space, skip 2 dc, shell\*. Repeat from \* to \* until the last stitch, slip stitch to join on the first chain of previous chain 3.

ROW 2: slip stitch on the next DC, slip stitch on space, chain 3, make 5 dc, \*single crochet between shell, make 6 dc in next space of shell\* repeat from \* to \* until the last stitch, slip stitch, join.

Weave it off. Done!

You can try both and see which one will be your favourite! :)
